## EVENT updates: 2021 Jr/Sr Fine Arts Competition

Results from March 11-12

The 2021 BCSO Fine Arts competition this year was a whole lot different than in the past due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This year, pictures were taken of art projects and sent to judges. For performance based events, videos were recorded and uploaded to YouTube as an unlisted video, which the judges were able to access and judge. All completed judging forms were emailed, printed, tallied, and entered into a spreadsheet designed to record and tally points. Even the awards assembly was different. Actually, the awards assembly consisted of a PowerPoint displaying the names of the winners along with pictures of the first place project winners. Overall, there were some challenges, but the Lord enabled us to overcome them and put on a successful competition.

Competing this year were: Carroll County Christian Academy, Fayette Christian School, Heritage Christian School (Brooklyn), Heritage Christian School (Findlay), Licking County Christian Academy, Lima Christian Academy, Temple Christian Academy (Fremont), Temple Christian School, Victory Christian School, Wayside Christian School, and Zanesville Christian

School. Just over two hundred fifty students were involved in the newfangled competition.

After all the judging forms were tallied, Heritage Christian School from Findlay earned the Outstanding School Total Points (2,568 points), while Zanesville Christian School earned the Outstanding School Highest Average (180.17 points per student). AnnaGrace Leszkowicz of Heritage Christian in Findlay was named the outstanding female competitor (474 points) while Truett Howell of Zanesville Christian was named the outstanding male competitor (670 points).

Thank you to each person who helped to make the competition a success. Special thanks go to Eric Leszkowicz for all his work in the art division. A special thank you also goes to the office staff for their labors.

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# BCSO students place at national competition

Students from Buckeye Christian School Organization competed in the annual American Association of Christian Schools (AACCS) National Competition, which was held virtually this year due to COVID-19 restrictions. Bob Jones University, a Christian liberal arts university in Greenville, SC, facilitated the virtual event.

Approximately 1,450 students from 28 states participated in the AACCS National Competition, having captured top honors in their state contests. The students, representing over 150 Christian high schools, competed in 72 categories in the five basic areas of Bible, music, speech, art, and academics.

The Bible competition included preaching and teaching. Academic competition included academic

testing in fifteen subjects, composition, and spelling. Vocal and instrumental music students challenged each other in eight solo and ten group competitions. Speech contestants participated in eleven different categories, such as dramatic interpretation, humorous interpretation, extemporaneous speaking, original oratory, and acting. Art students submitted art for seventeen different categories, such as sculpture, drawing, painting, printmaking, digital media, mixed media, woodworking, and photography.

The virtual event, judged by the faculty of Bob Jones University, concluded with a live-streamed awards ceremony, virtual campus tour, and master classes that provided contestants with an opportunity to learn tips and insights from competition judges.

media, Hollywood, state primary-secondary-preschool-higher education, and college (NCAA) and professional sports (NBA-NFL-MSL-MLB). Is this not a contemporary resurfacing of II Chronicles 18:5-13, where the four hundred false prophets spoke with one voice to Ahab and Jehoshaphat, saying, "Go up," while the one prophet of God (Micaiah) said, "Don't!"—and Micaiah paid for it (as we continue to pay for our schools and state schools, in case anybody missed the subtlety here)! The spirit of the age seduces the institutions of the age to speak with one voice!

BCSO is composed exclusively of "non-chartered, non-tax supported" (NCNT) schools. The state uses "charter" and "license" interchangeably, and a charter is a license which is a permission to operate. The battles look different today, but there is nothing new under the sun (only God can truly say, "I make a new thing"! Isaiah 43:19) We continue to tell the state that we are happy to work together with the God-ordained institution of the state, but we are not asking the state's permission to teach our children. We see a big difference between notifying (non-chartered) and asking permission (chartered).

Perhaps you have followed the ongoing debates regarding "critical race theory" and "black lives matter" (easily confused with the organization BLM). Again we remember Ecclesiastes 1:9 that declares that "there is nothing new under the sun," as the god of this world continues to percolate old ideas with different wording for a new and seductive cover. These are vain philosophies seeking to replace God with man who continues to desire to "be as God" (Genesis 3; Psalm 2:1-3; Colossians 2:8—Christians are told to beware of being spoiled by vain philosophy).

God's way in these last days is the local church, and by God's grace, BCSO continues to be a wonderful and practical tool in the hands of God-fearing local assemblies who demonstrate a continuing ability to work together even where there are different personalities and cultures, as different as High Street Christian and Licking County Christian Academies (or we could say Franklin and Licking counties)! BCSO's current "salt and light" influence is the passing of some kind of tuition tax credit legislation which encourages pre-tax dollars to be directed to church-operated schools—remember to pray that this will happen.

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
