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2023 BCSO Educators' Convention in the works

PCC's President Shoemaker to be keynote speaker; seeking workshop presenters

Cleveland Baptist Church in Brooklyn, Ohio will host the 2023 Buckeye State Christian Educators' Convention on Thursday, Sept. 28, 2023. The theme is "Approving Things that are Excellent" based on Philippians 1:10. This event will be one day only from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. Coffee and donuts will be provided beforehand from 9:00-9:45 a.m.

Last year, all BCSO were encouraged to attend the regional Great Lakes Christian Educators' Convention held in Kalamazoo, MI. Christian educators from Ohio, Michigan, Illinois, Indiana, Wisconsin and

Minnesota gathered for two days of general sessions and workshops designed to equip and encourage teachers and administrators. In 2021, many BCSO schools met in Temperance, MI for a similar convention at State Line Christian School. Typically, every third year BCSO recommends its member schools to either attend another state's convention or host its own. Hosting our own convention has not happened over the last several cycles; however, Mr. Luke Brown and the folks at Cleveland Baptist Church have decided to spearhead this year's event.

Senate Bill attempts to transfer educational authority to Governor

Protections in place remain for 08 schools, but unintended consequences unknown

The first bills introduced into the new two-year sessions of Ohio's General Assembly reveal the priorities of the Senate and House leadership. The first bill (Senate Bill 1) introduced into the 135th General Assembly (which began this January) is a bill that was almost passed in the previous session; it is a bill that will transfer state authority over education from the Board of Education to the Governor's office. The conservative legislators behind this bill (the liberals are against it) say that this is the way to stop some of the bad educational leadership coming out of the Board and Department of Education. This bill (with a different number) was fast-tracked at the very end of the 134th Session of Ohio's General Assembly, passing the Senate but narrowly

defeated in the House. The current arrangement has worked well for non-chartered, non-tax supported schools since the 08 provision began in 1982. Knowing how best to respond is challenging.

The foremost purpose of BCSO and the reason for its (CSO and BCSA) coming into existence was (and is) the preservation of the "non-chartered, non-tax supported" position, so this is a big deal for us. Much blood, sweat, and tears went into its (08) being given us, and we do not intend to let it go easily, in all of our busyness. The current bill (Senate Bill 1) has language that protects the non-chartered position, but one never knows about unintended consequences.

BCSO encourages "College Credit Plus" participation among member schools

Students can receive college credit while attending high school

A benefit of being an "08" school is participation in Ohio's "college credit plus" (CCP) program in courses taught by BCSO teachers. It allows seventh-through twelfth-grade students—while still living at home and participating in their local churches—to get college credit while attending high school! The students are enrolled in a participating college and in their high school at the same time ("dual enrollment").

According to the BCSO Regulations Summary, "Students from non-chartered, non-taxed schools must submit to the Ohio Department of Education by April 1 a letter of intent to participate the next

school year. The student must then be accepted by the college and submit an application for funding."

The long-term dream is that we have different BCSO schools offering these classes so that families who want their children to get this kind of college credit can do so (and at no cost, if you sign up on time)!

Does your school offer any such classes taught by one of your teachers (online or otherwise)? Currently, Lima is offering English composition (freshman research paper), English literature, and music appreciation online this fall, and we are hoping that other BCSO schools will offer other CCP courses.
